Dear Parents and Carers,

We are now well into our new term and the children are enjoying all the lunchtime and after School clubs. Our new Reception children have settled well into school life which is amazing! As we have seen a change in the weather, please ensure your child comes to school with a waterproof coat.

Attending School after 9am

If you arrive after 9am with a child or if you have items for your child, please bring them directly to the School Office and do not take them directly to the classroom. This is to ensure the safeguarding of all children. If running late, the child can be taken from the School office by staff to the classroom. This will ensure they are signed into the register. We thank you for your support.

Nasal Flu Vaccinations

The School-Age Immunisation Service is delivering the flu immunisation programme in Cornwall's and Devon's schools on behalf of NHS England & Improvement. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable friends and family by preventing the spread of flu.

In 2023/24 all children in Primary Schools from Reception to year 6 (inclusive) will be offered the vaccine. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children; it is administered by a quick and simple spray up the nose. Please enter https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/vaccinations/child-flu-vaccine/ to access information explaining the vaccination programme which also includes details about the small number of children for whom the nasal vaccine is not appropriate. Please submit your consent form by midday 2nd October 2023 to ensure your child receives their vaccination. If you experience any problems accessing the form please telephone 01872 221105 for Cornwall schools and 01392 342678 for Devon schools and the team will be happy to help. Please note that as in previous years you must opt into the programme. If a consent form is not submitted your child will not be vaccinated.

If your child becomes wheezy or has their asthma medication increased after you submit

this form, please contact us on the numbers above.

If you decide you do not want to vaccinate your child against flu, it would help us if you still complete and submit the consent form giving the reason. This will help us to plan and develop the service. Please tell us if you need this information in a different format. Yours faithfully

As you will be aware, the College works closely with its partner primary schools in delivering an exceptional transfer programme. As part of that process, the College will be holding two Open Evenings in September to welcome our prospective students. These evenings, which commence at 5.20pm for 5.30pm start in the Dining Hall, will give you an opportunity to hear a talk from our Principal and to have a tour of the College facilities and departments. Accelerated Reader

What is Renaissance Accelerated Reader?

Accelerated Reader (AR) is a computer program that helps teachers to manage and monitor children's independent reading practice. Your child picks a book at his/her own level and reads it at his/her own pace. When finished, your child takes a short quiz on the computer - passing the quiz is an indication that your child has understood what has been read. Teachers may assist pupils by: • Guiding them to books appropriate to their ability and interests • Asking probing questions as your child reads and before quizzing • Pairing your child with others, reading with or reading to your child. • Since they are reading books at their own reading and interest levels, most children are likely to be successful and enjoy the books and quizzes.

When will my child start Accelerated Reader?

Most children are ready to start Accelerated Reader by the start of Year 3. Once children are proficient and fluent readers (as assessed by the Little Wandle assessments), we work with them for at least half a term to help them to learn to use the system and develop the skills needed to answer the comprehension questions. Once we are confident that they are ready, they begin to access AR independently. We monitor their quizzing closely and will support children as and when needed with 1:1 reads focussed on their next steps.

How can I help my child become a better reader?

As with anything, performance improves with practice. According to Renaissance Learning's research, children who read at least 20 minutes a day with a 90% comprehension rate on AR quizzes see the greatest gains. Encourage your child to read at home, discuss books, ask questions about what they have read and visit your local library. •

What is a Renaissance Star Reading® test?

Star Reading is used to determine your child's reading level. It is a computer based reading assessment program that uses computer-adaptive technology. Questions continually adjust to your child's responses.

If the child's response is correct, the difficulty level is increased. If the child cannot answer a question or answers incorrectly, the difficulty level is reduced. The test uses multiple-choice questions and takes approximately 20 minutes to complete. Children complete these tests half termly to determine their ZPD level which determines the level of books which are appropriate for them to read. These results are monitored by class teachers and our reading lead/ Head of School.

What is a Book Level?

Book Levels are reported using the $ATOS^{TM}$ readability formula and represent the difficulty of the text. The levels range from 0.5 - 13.5. Books are chosen based on the ZPD range recommended for each pupil by Star Reading

What is a Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD)? ZPD is the range of books that will challenge a child without causing frustration or loss of motivation. Your child will receive a ZPD, or reading range, after taking a Star Reading test. These may fluctuate and it is normal for a ZPD to fall occasionally, as long as the general trend is upwards. Children should be encouraged to choose books from their ZPD however, they may choose books outside their ZPD. In this case the class teacher will monitor the results and may adjust the ZPD / guide book choices accordingly as it is important for children to read with a high degree of comprehension and within his/her ZPD.

What are points? Every book that has an AR Reading Practice Quiz is given a points value. AR points are based on the length of the book (number of words). Pupils earn a percentage of points according to how well they pass the quiz.

What is an Interest Level? The Interest Level indicates for which age group a book is appropriate, based on the content and themes. These are recommendations only and teachers and parents are recommended to use their best judgement when guiding pupils to books. The examples below have a Book Level of 4.0 since both have short sentences and vocabulary that is simple. However, Noughts and Crosses is intended for older pupils - Upper Years - while The Enormous Crocodile is Lower Years. • Where can I find further information? Schools collect, store, process, share and dispose of lots of personal information relating to pupils and parents. The purpose of this privacy notice is to let pupils and parents know how and why we are processing your personal data, the rights you have around this and the school's legal obligation and responsibility for protecting your data.

Data Collection Information - PLEASE ENSURE THIS SHEET IS RETURNED ASAP!

At school we have an electronic pupil information system where we record important information about your child's personal details, nearest contacts and their details, relevant medical and dietary details, and any other important information supplied by parents and carers.

Each year we ask for parents and carers to check that the information we hold is correct and up to date and to inform us of any changes. Coming home next week with your child is the Data Collection sheet. Please can all parents check the details we have regarding your child and return the signed paperwork to the office by Friday 22nd September. ALL data sheets need to be returned. It is vitally important

that this information is up to date for every child in school and particularly with regard to any contact or medical information the school needs to be aware of.

Agreements/Consent Forms

During the course of your child's education, all parents and carers complete a KS1 and a KS2 Agreement pack which contains consent for your child for local school visits, photos, video, audio and communication. If you wish to update/opt out of any of your child's consent information then please contact the school office in the first instance. You can request for this information to be updated or can opt in/out at any time during the academic year.

Online platforms

We are currently working to iron out a few teething problems with some of our online platforms. Accelerated Reader has updated their site which appears to be causing issues for some users - teachers and students alike! Please let us know if you are unable to login. Likewise, Google Classroom has been set up by our technical support team but is experiencing a few teething problems. If you have problems logging on, please let us know. We can pass it on for the technical team to resolve. We will signpost guides and information on how to access Google Classroom next week. TT Rockstars is also up and running and all pupils from Year 2 upwards should have bought home logins. If you child does not have their login for any of these platforms, or is experiencing any problems with them, please let the office know.

Birthdays

Please can we ask that children do not bring in sweets and treats for their birthday for the other children. We have a lot of children with allergies and, with the cost of living, it can cause anxiety and stress for those families who are unable to provide this luxury. Thank you for your understanding.

School Improvement

This week we are sharing our School Development Plan priorities. Our development plan is reviewed on a yearly basis and leads our school improvement. Each half term, we monitor our progress and amend as needed.

Our current curriculum priorities are: Early reading, writing for all year groups and developing the maths curriculum. We are also prioritising: the development of our subject leaders - ensuring that they are in a position to quality assure the curriculum being implemented in the classes; attendance - making sure that all pupils and families are supported to remove barriers to school attendance and our personal development curriculum - providing opportunities outside of the normal classroom learning to support the curriculum. Finally we are working with our parent forum to improve parent communication.

Further information about these priorities and the work we are doing will be shared over the coming weeks.


