#### Modbury Road Closure

As you are probably aware the main road in Modbury will be closed due to roadworks starting on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> January. We have been in contact with South West Water since before the holidays and they have just confirmed that they will be installing a temporary set of pelican lights to provide a safe crossing from the housing estate. We are aware that this means lots of traffic will be parking in the new housing estate. Please park carefully and be mindful of the residents. If you are approaching from Back Street, please either cross over into the new estate at the top of Back Street and use the safe designated walking route around to the temporary crossing. Alternatively, we will be opening the new main entrance from 8.55 for 5 minutes only.

#### Music Mondays

Happy New Year and welcome to 2024 and the opportunity to continue your musical journey! Choir and music lessons will start on Monday 8th January.

Folding up music and stuffing it in their music case or bag, results in music getting lost or too crumpled to balance on a stand.

## **ART CLUB**

Come and create 2d and 3d artworks using a range of materials and techniques, fire up your imagination and be creative.

Previous after school art projects have included:

- Printing and painting card, cutting out shapes and making layered 3D insects
- Making sketch books and their own design of stamps, then printing a wonderful personalised cover
- collograph printing
- Looking at other artists work and making artworks which have been inspired by them (including the artists Chiaozza and the children made wonderful abstract papier mache cacti)
- Printmaking using gelli pads
- Printmaking using empty tetra packs
- Dice-Rolling Abstract art game to produce beautiful abstract artwork
- Rolled and stamped clay decorations
- Mini theatres complete with scenery and characters
- Stitching their own monster 'softie' dolls
- Mixed media funky decorated spectacles

The cost includes all materials, though if the children are keen to do a clay project there will be a small additional charge for the extra costs involved. Children must bring their own protective clothing as we will be using paints, inks etc which won't necessarily wash out of clothing!
