practising their maths on the number square!








# Crowning of the Wassail Queen



# **Music Mondays**

Just a reminder that I am away this coming Monday (15th Jan). Whilst there will be no music lessons, Mrs Woods will still run choir. The following week all music clubs will be on Tuesday 23rd Jan.

I have spoken to the children this week about remembering their equipment and organising their music. There are many Mondays when children either don't have their instrument or music which disrupts lessons as we run around trying to find spares and extra copies.

#### Music Folders:

Children need an A4 folder of some form. Ideally and old A4 ring binder with some plastic pockets works best. See what you can find in a cupboard to reuse? Alternatively a book folder with plastic sleeves to slide music in and out. At the very least a cardboard A4 document wallet. Folding up music and stuffing it in their music case or bag, results in music getting lost or too crumpled to balance on a stand.
